

NSANZ 2021 Wrap Up

The Neuromodulation Society of Australia and New Zealand successfully ran their 14th Annual Scientific Meeting on the weekend of 14 – 15 August 2021.

The NSANZ Board, Conference Committee and Conference Managers, DC Conference & Association Management (DCC&A) were forced to flip NSANZ 2021 to a completely virtual conference 6 weeks before the conference was due to be held at the Sofitel Brisbane Central, Queensland.

A total of 209 delegates registered for the virtual NSANZ 2021, including delegates, presenters and sponsor representatives.

The program included 3 plenary sessions, 8 concurrent sessions, 6 sponsored sessions, 6 Meet the Experts sponsored sessions and 17 3-minute e-poster recordings.

The conference incorporated a small virtual exhibition of 1 Titanium Sponsor, 5 Premium Sponsors and 4 Supporters.

The virtual platform engaged for NSANZ 2021 was the EventsAIR OnAIR platform, the portal used 3D mode, which gave delegates a “life like” feel.
